- **Mary Seacole** was born in Jamaica.
- Her mother was a nurse who taught her traditional African and Caribbean remedies for illnesses.
- Mary wanted to help soldiers in the Crimean War but was denied.
- She made her own way to Crimea and set up a Hospital called 'British Hotel'.
- When she returned from the war she was bankrupt (she had no money) as she had spent it all on medical goods.
- The soldiers called her 'Mother Seacole'.

- **Rosa Parks** was born on February 4, 1913 in Tuskegee, Alabama.
- She is famous for not giving up her seat on a bus to a white person on December 1, 1955, in Montgomery, Alabama
- This was very important because at that time, Black people were required to give up their seats to white people on public buses.
- Rosa Parks' brave act helped start the Civil Rights Movement
