Families

Families can look different: some have one parent, some have two, some are blended (with step-parents or step-siblings), some are foster or adoptive.

Families are groups of people who care for each other. Some may have pets too!

Families can be different in race, religion, gender, marriage, or age — but they are all special.

Sometimes families change, and this can cause problems or arguments.

Communities

A community is when you feel like you belong to a group of people who share things in common.

If someone is left out or excluded, they might feel like they don't belong.

Respect and Anti-racism

We should all stand up to racism.

If someone says or does something racist, you can calmly and respectfully say: "That's not right."

Ourselves and Others

Positive attributes are things we are good at. Goals are things we are trying to get better at.

Everyone has different strengths and goals, and that's okay.

Online Bullying

Online bullying can mean sending unkind messages or sharing hurtful, false, or mean things about someone.

This can make people feel sad, lonely, angry, or frustrated.

Touch and Relationships

There are safe touches (like gentle, caring touches) and unsafe touches (like ones that hurt or feel uncomfortable). Relationships can be healthy (kind, caring, respectful) or unhealthy (mean, unkind, unsafe).

Getting Help
