Henry Tudor defeated Richard III at the Battle of Bosworth.	Henry VII (Henry Tudor) married Elizabeth of York, uniting the Lancastrians and York houses and ending the Wars of the Roses (civil war).	Henry VII's son Arthur died, leaving a widow (Catherine of Aragon) and his 11 year old brother Henry next in line to the throne.	Henry VII died and is succeeded by his son Henry VIII. He married his brother's widow, Catherine of Aragon to continue an alliance with	Henry VIII married Anne Boleyn, following a divorce from Catherine of Aragon. Anne Boleyn gave birth to Elizabeth	Henry VIII formed the Church of England, separating England from the Roman Catholic Church.	Anne Boleyn was executed. Eleven days later Henry married Jane Seymour.	Finally Henry VIII had his male heir - Edward was born, but a few days later Jane died	Henry VIII died and was succeeded by Edward VI.
