Our learning is broken down into 7 keys areas of development. The activities that we will doing in each of these areas is shown below:

Communication and Language Development

- Children should be able to respond to what they hear with relevant questions and comments when being read to.
- Children should be able to comment on what they have heard and what's been expressed by others in conversation or discussions.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Children should be able to take steps to resolve conflicts with other children, e.g. finding a compromise.
- Children should be able to understand their own feelings and the feelings of others.

Literacy

- Children need to begin to read words and simple sentences.
- Find out about the differences between fiction and non-fiction books.
- Children should be able to label and write short captions.

Phonics

Children have been put into groups in which they feel confident and challenged.

Please make sure your child is reading and practising their letter sounds and key words every day.

Reception Learning and Development

Understanding the World

- To describe their immediate environment, using knowledge from observation from non fiction texts and maps.
- To explain similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries, drawing on knowledge from stories, and non fictions texts.

Physical Development

- Children need to be able to use a pencil and holds it effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed.
- Show some understanding that good practices with regard to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene can contribute to good health.

Talk with your child about healthy and unhealthy foods, make a shopping list of healthy foods, draw and label healthy foods.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Children should be able to adapts work where necessary.
- Children need to select tools and techniques needed to shape, assemble and join materials they are using.



Mathematics

- To be able to subitise (recognise a quantity of objects without counting) to 5. You can play dice games, subitise on 1 minute maths, play frustration the board game.
- To have a deep understanding of number to 10 including composition of number.
- To be able to know some number bonds to 5, moving onto automatic recall of number bonds. You can play games with 5 objects, hiding some objects out of 5, showing children the remaining amount for them to work out how many have been hidden.
