Attendance and Punctuality

- It is vital that your child comes to school <u>every day</u> and on time
- Soft start begins at 8:35
- Registers close at 8.50 (Teaching starts promptly and your child will be marked late if they arrive after this time.)
- Please ensure you are collecting your children on time from the classroom at 3:20pm.

School Lunch and Snacks

- All children in Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal. You do not need to pay!
- Your child does not have to have a school dinner every day. Check the school website to see the menus and you can choose which meals your child would like to eat.
- Year 2 children do not need to bring in a snack as this is provided for all children in the year group. However, should you wish to send a snack in with your child, please ensure it is healthy and nut-free eg. Fruit, vegetable (the same rule applies for packed lunches).
- If you are in receipt of any benefits, please apply for Free School Meals. You can enquire about this at the main Reception.

Reading

Children are expected to read for at least 10-15 minutes every day.

- Most books will be a phonetically decodable book which will focus on the sound your child has been learning in the week.
- Reading books will be changed twice a week.
- Reading records must be signed by an adult and brought in daily.
- New books will not be given if the Reading record is not in school.

Home Learning

Draw your observations of your plant and write what you notice.



Appointments to see your child's teacher

- If you need to discuss something, please come and speak to us when you collect your child at the end of the day.
- If you are going to need a longer amount of time, then please arrange an appointment via the school office or with the teacher at collection time.
- Appointments with a class teacher in the morning need to be before 8:30am or after the children have been dismissed at 3:20pm.
- Updating you on your children's progress we will do this through our parents meeting and reports.

After School Clubs

- A list of After School clubs will be available in the next 2-3 weeks.
 Children will only be able to attend one session per week.
- The booking will go live on Parent Pay at 5pm on the release day. If a space is available, children will be given their 1st choice club then removed from any additional preferences.
- Waiting lists will be created if a club is over-subscribed.
 Additional spaces may be offered if available. You will be contacted from the school office, if a place becomes available.
- Invited (booster) clubs You will receive a letter from a class teacher prior to clubs becoming available. This is a free club and will run for 8 weeks and will be based on teacher assessments to address specific gaps in learning.

Trips



- A parent calendar of key dates will be released each term on our school website, under the parent's tab and parent school events calendar.
- Most trips will be **linked to areas of the curriculum** e.g. Science, History, Geography
- There will also be local trips eg. Library, Religious buildings, local area walks
- Teachers will inform parents of trips and costs in advance which must be paid by the date stated in the letter via ParentPay. ParentPay payment also acts as consent. If payment is not made, we do not have consent to take children on these visits.
- Parent volunteers are encouraged and will be selected randomly before the trip. We can only take a limited number of adults on each trip. This includes school staff.
- Teachers will inform parents if they have been chosen.

Religion and Worldviews Trips

- Educational visits to places of worship are a fundamental part of the curriculum.
- Purpose = embed knowledge and deepen understanding.
- Children WILL NOT BE ASKED TO PARTAKE IN ACTIVITIES SPECIFIC TO ANY RELIGION. (E.g. praying or worshipping).
