Literacy

In Literacy we will begin the term with the story 'The Whales' Song'. Children will be retelling the story and using exciting language to write a setting description.

After this children will be reading 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. Children will be retelling the story, and writing instructions to make a disgusting sandwich.

You can support your child by sharing books and stories from your own and other cultures. Also reading comics would be enjoyable reading for many of your children in addition to their colour banded reading books.

Science

This half term our topic will be 'Habitats' which is about the different environments in which animals live. What makes a good habitat. We will also learn about food chains.

Computing

Children will begin to understand what data means and how this can be collected in the form of a tally chart. They will then present data in the form of pictograms and finally block diagrams. Children will use the data presented to answer questions.

Art

In Art children will develop their craft skills. They will also be learning about digital art. The theme for this topic will be based around Harry Beck and his designs for underground maps.

History

This term we will be learning about significant historical events. We will be focusing on Guy Fawkes. Children will learn about who Guy Fawkes was. They will research what the Gunpowder plot was and will also learn about why Guy Fawkes was involved in the Gunpowder plot. Music

Children have recently been introduced to recorders. They will continue to develop their skills to play the recorder.

P.E

In PE, children have been learning different invasion games such as football and netball.

Maths

We will be learning to find fractions in shapes and amounts and will solve fraction problems. Learn more about fractions through the BBC Bitesize KS1 Maths: https://www.bbc.co.uk/ bitesize/topics/z3rbg82

Our work on measures will include using a ruler to measure in centimetres and metres and solving measures problems. We will also learn about capacity (ml/l) and mass (g/kg). Doing some baking with the children will help their understanding of these concepts. They will also be learning to read time.

Children will then be learning about position and direction, including clockwise and anti-clockwise, quarter, half and three-quarter turns.

P.S.H.E

Our topic is 'Living in the wider world'. We will be focusing on how to keep safe and discussing rules around household products. We will also be learning about the importance of community.
