
<u>Vocabulary</u>

Word	Definition
temperature	A measurement by a thermometer of how hot or cold a place is.
season	The UK has four seasons: autumn, winter, spring and summer. A weather pattern is linked to each season.
weather	The conditions of place: hot or cold / dry or wet / windy or calm.
rain gauge	A piece of equipment to measure the amount of rainfall in a place
