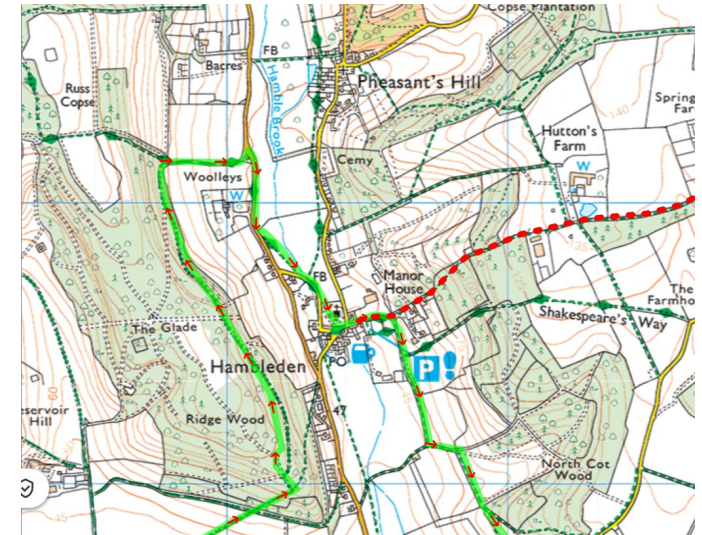

Vocabulary

Word	Definition
settlement	Places where groups of people live and work.
urban	Well developed area of human structures such as commercial buildings, roads, bridges, railways etc.
rural	An area of land with not many buildings or people, but usually used for farming.
services	A system that supplies a public need, for example waste collection.
facilities	A building, piece of equipment or place that is used for an activity or purpose.
population	The total number of people living in a particular area.
