A relationship is anyone we have a connection with e.g. family member, friend, club member, teachers, religious group, imaginary friend.

Friendship is important because it means having someone to play and laugh with, it can be fun, it gives us someone to share things with, and it can help us to feel good. Our differences such as religion, belief, appearance and family are not as important as our similarities.

Bullying is repeated negative behaviour towards someone else, that is intended to cause harm. It can be face to face or online. It can be physical verbal or emotional.

The most important things about family life could be: having fun together, playing games, celebrating events, having shared interests/hobbies, listening to each other, helping and caring for each other, cooking/eating meals together or giving hugs/cuddles. Most of the time families members get on with each other. It is important to talk to someone if you are worried about family relationships.

We can communicate in different ways with each other, including online through messages and videocalls. We can also chat through games.

People we have never met in real life can message us on games. We should never arrange to meet them in real life.

We should report messages that make us uncomfortable to an adult. The adult can help us make the right choice about what to do next e.g. delete, report or block.

I should ask for permission in certain situations and give permission if I want to. It is important to respect and personal space and boundaries of others.

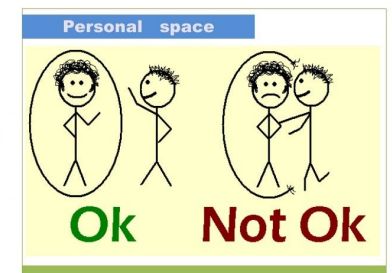
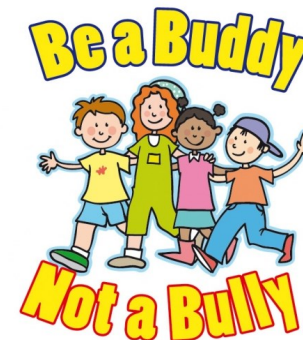
