There are different family structures e.g. single parent families, blended families, foster families, adoptive

All families are a 'group' of people, some have pets, children live with a parent or parents, some parents are married, they are all unique/special, loving and caring for each other. They might have differences in race, religion, gender, marriage or ages.

Changes can happen in families and this can cause difficulties or conflict between family members.

Belonging to a community means that you feel part of a group that have things in common. Some of the ways in which people can be made to feel that they don't belong, are being left out or excluded.

Positive attributes in others are things that we are good at doing and goals are things we are working on. These could be different from those around me.

Online bullying can included sending of unkind messages but also sending, posting or sharing negative, harmful or false content about someone. The feelings and emotions that might arise from online bullying are sadness, loneliness, anger and frustration.

There are lots of different ways that people can touch each other, and some of these are appropriate (i.e. safe, comfortable, gentle) but some are inappropriate (i.e. unsafe, uncomfortable, hurtful). Relationships can be both healthy and unhealthy.


