Explain the purpose of the Eightfold Path and the link to the Dharma Wheel.

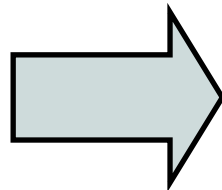
Have the information to hold a discussion as to whether suffering is necessary or helpful.
